Harveys Lake EAC is offering well water tests to Harveys Lake residents 10am and 12noon on Saturday, July 23

The cost is \$100 (compared to a retail value of more than \$225). Interested residents should register with Denise, at (570)639-1042.

Residents' water will be tested for Alkalinity (Total as CaCO3), Chloride, Fluoride, Hardness, Nitrate as N, Orthophosphate, pH (Standard Units), Sulfate, Total Dissolved Solids, Turbidity (Turbidity Units), Total Coliform with e. coli check, Aluminum, Arsenic, Barium, Cadmium, Calcium, Chromium, Copper, Iron, Lead, Magnesium, Manganese, Mercury, Nickel, Potassium, Selenium, Silica, Silver, Sodium and Zinc.

Participants can pick up water sampling kits from Denise at the Harveys Lake Borough Building beginning July 11. Water samples must be dropped off between 10am and noon on July 23 at the Borough Building's meeting room, where scientists will perform certain tests immediately. Confidential final test results will be mailed to participants directly from the Water Research Center within two weeks of the testing date. Payment in full for the testing is due on July 23.

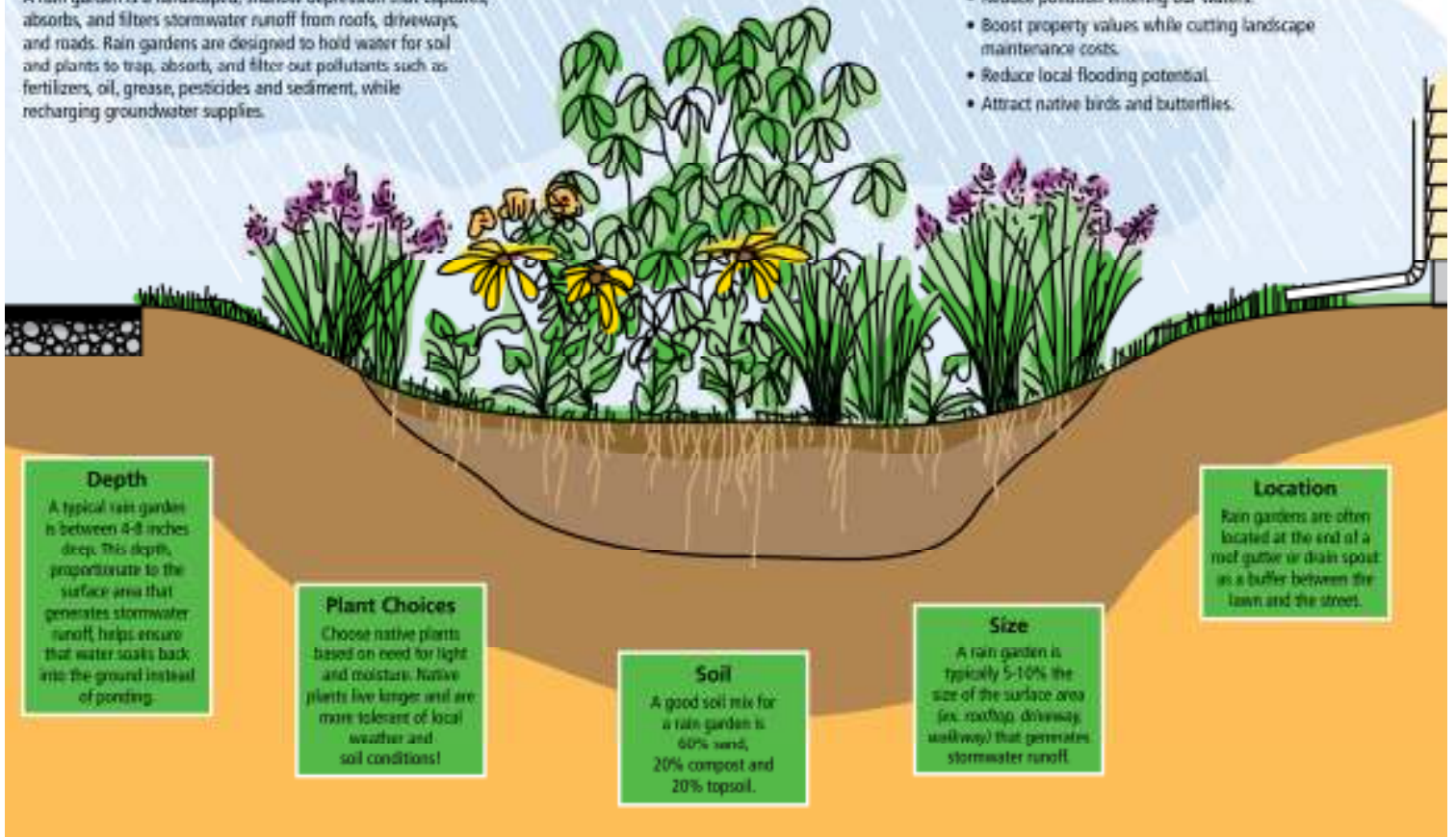
Rain Gardens Have Many Benefits

What is a Rain Garden?

A rain garden is a landscaped, shallow depression that captures, absorbs, and filters stormwater runoff from roofs, driveways, and roads. Rain gardens are designed to hold water for soil and plants to trap, absorb, and filter out pollutants such as fertilizers, oil, grease, pesticides and sediment, while recharging groundwater supplies.

Rain Gardens Help:

- Reduce pollution entering our waters.
- Boost property values while cutting landscape maintenance costs.
- Reduce local flooding potential.
- Attract native birds and butterflies.



NOTE FROM THE ZONING OFFICER

There are several changes to the permitting process which may add time to the overall approval. **Stormwater Management Applications** must be filled out for all additions, new builds, sheds and patios. These are no charge and deal with the “new” area that will become impervious. **Sewage Facilities Planning Module Application Mailers** are necessary for all additions and new builds. DEP receives these and then determines if sewage planning is required and which component is applicable. **Demolition Permit Applications** require a copy of proof of ownership(deed) and may require an Asbestos Abatement Evaluation Certificate from DEP. *****Job Johnnys require a \$10.00 placement permit, and extensive landscaping projects involving concrete walkways and retaining walls probably require a phone discussion.
