"Take 10" and Help Harveys Lake Borough Get What it Needs for the Next 10 Years

In March 2010, more than 130 million addresses will receive a 2010 Census form by mail or hand delivery. The 2010 Census will document the changes in our nation since the last decennial census in 2000, and tell us how we've evolved as a country. Because census data affect how more than \$400 billion in federal funding is distributed to tribal, state and local governments, the census also will frame the future of our country and our community for the next 10 years.

During Census 2000, the mail participation rate was 72 percent as of the April 2000 cut-off. About \$85 million is saved for every one percent increase in mail participation. For these and many other reasons, we must work to encourage everyone's participation in the census.

Here's what you should know about the 2010 Census:

- It's easy. One of the shortest census forms in history, the 2010 Census form asks 10 questions and takes about 10 minutes to complete. The individual in whose name the housing unit is rented or owned should complete the form on behalf of every person living there, both relatives and nonrelatives.
- It's important. Census data are used to reapportion seats in Congress and ensure proper district representation in state and local governments. Information from the census helps determine locations for child-care and senior centers, new roads, hospitals, schools and community centers.
- It's safe. By law, the U.S. Census Bureau cannot share respondents' answers with anyone, including other federal agencies and law enforcement entities. All Census Bureau employees take an oath of nondisclosure and are sworn for life to protect the confidentiality of the data. The penalty for unlawful disclosure is a fine of up to \$250,000 or imprisonment of up to five years, or both.

HARVEYS LAKE POLICE DEPT

The Harvey's Lake Police Department is staffed by 3 full time officers and 7 part time officers. Police provide 24 hour service 365 days a year to borough residents and patrol an average of 5771 miles per month with 3 patrol vehicles.

During 2009 police responded to a total of 2048 calls for service, 46 criminal arrests, issued 159 citations, and 130 written / verbal warnings.

Police wish to advise all residents to keep their homes, businesses, and vehicles secured in their absence, and request all residents to properly identify their homes by providing sufficient numerical identification on the home or mailbox.

Police are also offering a free Safety Inspection of your home. Call the office to set up your appointment.

Since July 2009, Harvey's Lake Borough has made significant needed improvements to the police department including outside cosmetic work, a new heating system, and state of the art technology which enable officers to work more efficiently.



- Police have recently enrolled in a resident information system called NIXLE
- NIXLE allows police to send important messages to residents, either via e-mail or cell phone
- Residents could sign up for this free service by visiting the website nixle.com.

Chief Daniel Evancho will be available at the police station prior to the monthly council meeting from 5:30pm-7:15pm should a resident feel the need to stop in for any issue, or he may be contacted at 639-1690.

Well Water Testing Offered

On <u>Saturday morning, July 24</u>, a comprehensive package of drinking water tests will be offered once again at a deeply discounted price to Harveys Lake residents by Wilkes University together with the Harveys Lake EAC.



On Saturday morning, August 14, a free follow-up Q&A session on water well systems and non-point source pollution issues will be held.

The test package will remain priced at \$75 (compared to a retail value of at least \$180), but additional parameters will be tested this year. The Wilkes University Water Quality Laboratory will measure residents' water for pH, conductivity, turbidity, total dissolved solids, total coliform, fecal coliform, fecal streptococcus, sodium, potassium, copper, iron, manganese, zinc, chloride, sulfate, nitrate-nitrite, and phosphate. (This testing is being done for informational and educational purposes only and does not meet the requirements of a legal baseline.)

Interested residents should register with Denise, at 639-1042. Participants can pick up water sampling kits at the Harveys Lake Borough Building between July 12 and 24. Water samples must be dropped off between 10am and noon on July 24 at the Borough Building's meeting room, where scientists will perform certain tests immediately. Confidential final test results will be mailed to participants directly from the Wilkes laboratory within two weeks of the testing date. Payment in full for the testing is due on July 24.

The well water and non-point source pollution Q&A session will be conducted at 10AM on August 14 by Brian Oram, a professional geologist and Director of the Wilkes University Center for Environmental Quality Water Lab. Brian will make an informative presentation and then take questions from the public. Brian's past Q&A sessions here at the lake have been greatly appreciated by all attendees.

Additional supports of the Q&A program and educational outreach are The Consortium for Scientific Assistance to Watersheds (C-SAW), the Pocono Northeast Resource Conservation and Development Council and Wilkes University.



RECYCLING 24/7 AND GARBAGE DETAILS

Harveys Lake Borough's recycling is still on a voluntary basis. The dumpster is available 24/7 at the Borough Garage, outside of the gate near the Little League field.

We accept co-mingled (plastic, glass jars, bottles, tin, aluminum, bimetal cans) and newspapers. Newspapers can be placed in paper bags or tied or just dumped in the dumpster. Please NO PLASTIC BAGS in the dumpster. There is a trash can available to throw plastic bags into when you dump.

<u>Garbage within the Borough is picked up on Mondays</u> and each resident is allowed three bags <u>or</u> three (33) gallon containers. If you think you are going to have more than three bags, stickers are available at the Borough office for a fee of \$3.00 each. We now also have a bulk item sticker for large items at a cost of \$20 each.

2010 DUMPING DATES

Spring Dump Date is set for Saturday, May 15th 8-12 noon Fall Dump Date is Saturday, September 18, 10-12 noon

- Cars and ½ ton trucks \$25.00 per load
- Vehicles over ½ ton \$50.00 per load

In Addition:

- Tires are \$5.00 for each car tire (can not be cut!)
- \$10.00 for each truck tire. (can not be cut!)
- All tires must be off the rims
- Batteries and propane tanks will be \$3.00 each.
- All major white appliances are \$10.00 each.

Shingles, drywall or insulation are no longer accepted Residents are required to have a permit. Permits are available from the Borough Office Monday through Friday 7:30 A.M. to 3:30 P.M. Those wishing to obtain a permit must show proof of residence, such as a current driver's license or Borough tax receipt. No permits will be issued at the dump site.
